## ***Massachusetts Housing and Shelter Alliance Receives Boston Foundation Grant to Expand Housing First Efforts to End Homelessness***

**BOSTON** – The Massachusetts Housing and Shelter Alliance (MHSA) has been awarded a grant of \$40,000 by the Boston Foundation for an initiative to address chronic homelessness, MHSA President & Executive Director Joe Finn said today.

“This generous grant from the Boston Foundation will allow MHSA to continue easing the plight of the chronically homeless, a group that is the costliest population of homeless individuals,” said Finn. “These economic times demand investment in solutions that save money and work to end homelessness. We are continually grateful to the Boston Foundation, a true partner in our effort to advance an approach to homelessness that is humane, efficient and cost-effective.”

The grant, entitled *Beyond Home & Healthy for Good: An Initiative to End Chronic Homelessness*, will allow advocacy for and development of policy and practice that will reduce barriers to health care for the poorest citizens of the Commonwealth of Massachusetts, homeless individuals. It will advance a Housing First approach to chronic homelessness. Housing First is a strategy that places homeless individuals directly into permanent housing and provides them with an array of supportive services including medical and mental health care, substance abuse treatment programs, case management and vocational and life skills training. The *Home & Healthy for Good* program has provided housing and supportive services to more than 350 chronically homeless individuals since its inception.

The Boston Foundation, Greater Boston’s community foundation, is one of the oldest and largest community foundations in the nation, with assets of \$763 million. In fiscal year 2008, the Foundation and its donors made close to \$79 million in grants to nonprofit organizations and received gifts of more than \$113 million. The Foundation is made up of nearly 900 separate charitable funds, established by donors either for the general benefit of the community or for special purposes. The Foundation also serves as a major civic leader, provider of information, convener and sponsor of special initiatives designed to address the community’s and the region’s most pressing challenges.
